


Must see in

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Pura Mangkunegaran was built in 1757 through a long history. After the death of Amangkurat IV, the King of Mataram Palace, the palace's always intervened by the Dutch colonialist and then succeeded putting Adipati Anom (PB II) as an heir of the palace. Even though, Prince Arya Mangkunegaran, an legitimate heir, against the Dutch colonialist so that led to war. Then Raden Mas Said, son of Arya Mangkunegaran, took the fight to against the Dutch colonialist and

finally through Giyanti Agreement, Raden

Mas Said became the king of Pura Mangkunegaran (Mangkunegaran I) and inherited north region of Solo, based in Pura Mangkunegaran.



Klewer Market is the biggest batik market in Indonesia. Established in 1970 the market is still expanding until now. You can find many kinds of batik here, both finished clothes as shirts and dresses as well as fabric, all in a bewildering variety of design. Nearby you will also find many normal clothes stores and food stalls.





After reconstruction it becomes a very nice green woody area. It is a public park. Local come here with the family or friends, having picnic, dating, having fun on the lake in a pedal boat. There is also a small reptile zoo in the area. You can also find lot of trees, some old statues, a lake, an Art Building (for performances, exposition etc.), a small swimmingpool, an open stage, a plant nursery area and last but not least some animals like monkeys, turkey, a rooster, chickens, deers, pigeon etc



If you are in search of classic batik then you need to visit Laweyan Batik Village. This village is famous for its history – in the past a lot of wealthy batik businessmen lived here. Visiting Laweyan feels a tiny bit like you are stepping back into the past. You can walk through the small alleys, see old spots/buildings that are very attractive and also do a bit of boutique shopping. When you visit Laweyan you can learn how to make batik, see how batik is created and do some batik shopping.
